

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

Kansas Board of Regents Transfer Policy Pilot

***JOHNSON COUNTY COMMUNITY COLLEGE
UNIVERSITY OF KANSAS EDWARDS CAMPUS***

July 2019

This memorandum of understanding (MOU) summarizes the agreement between Johnson County Community College (JCCC) and the University of Kansas Edwards Campus (KUEC) to cooperatively execute the proposed Transfer Policy Pilot project outlined herein. We are entering into this partnership to better serve transfer students, to mutually benefit our institutions, and to collect evidence to determine the effectiveness of this policy augmentation for other institutions in the state. The following understandings will guide this effort, until modified or amended.

Section 1: Policy Definition

KBOR Policy Manual Chapter III.A.9 Degrees B.2

(e) The University of Kansas Edwards campus may have transfer agreements with Johnson County Community College that make programmatic exceptions to the requirement that a minimum of 60 semester credit hours be from institutions that have a majority of degree conferrals at or above the baccalaureate level. The University of Kansas and Johnson County Community College shall report annually to the Board Academic Affairs Standing Committee on the number and type of programs subject to transfer agreements entered into pursuant to this exception, the number of Johnson County Community College students transferring in more than 60 hours into such programs, and their success.

Section 2: Partner Expectations

JCCC and KUEC are responsible for identifying and defining “programmatic exceptions” that are critical to the intent of this policy augmentation. These artifacts and results will be included in annual reports to KBOR as needed to demonstrate pilot outcomes. Issues relating to articulation, class content, or other curricular matters will be resolved by the Chief Academic Officers or their designees at each institution.

Section 3: Data and Reporting

JCCC and KUEC are responsible for establishing a data and reporting plan to collect all requested student success and completion results as well as related institutional impacts of this pilot program. This data will be reported to KBOR annually and as needed.

Student data will be shared between institutions, as permitted by law in accordance with the Family Education Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA).

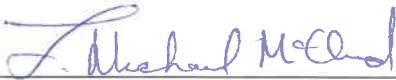
Section 4: Terms and Termination

This agreement shall not create any rights in any third parties, specifically any individual students attending these institutions. The only parties to this agreement are KUEC and JCCC. This agreement does not involve KU Lawrence based academic programs or other affiliates of the University of Kansas during this pilot period.

Neither party shall not use the name, trade name, trademark or any other designation of the other, or any contraction, abbreviation, adaptation or simulation of any of the foregoing, in any advertisement or for any commercial or promotional purpose (other than in performing under this Agreement) without the party's prior written consent in each case.

Amendments to this agreement must be in writing and approved by the designated representative of each institution. Either party may terminate this agreement for cause by giving written notice to the designated representative at least 90 days prior to the commencement of a new academic term with KBOR approval.
